New course title: (part one)

Great guitars, great songs and great harmonies: roots and royalty of country-rock, 1965-1980

Creating a new American musical genre--how two immensely popular forms of roots music merged to create a timeless style, uniquely American in every aspect.

Description: Part One

This class will cover the beginnings of the historically significant country-rock movement which started in LA in 1965, and spread across the country, changing the musical landscape of popular music. We will explore how two roots-oriented styles--country music and rock and roll--borrowed from each other and merged to create a new musical genre which has since spawned many sub-genres, each with its own unique approach to country-rock. We will look at several artists and their key albums, including: The Everly Brothers, The Byrds, the Buffalo Springfield, Gram Parsons, and the Flying Burrito Brothers.
