WHAT WENT WRONG?

This class tells the story of the American attempt to transform Afghanistan into a Western-style capitalist democracy. We start with context—a social portrait of Afghans on the eve of their tragedy; then the build-up—the dramatic events that brought the Taliban to power; and then the story that began with NATO forces driving the Taliban from Kabul and ended 20 years later with a chaotic American withdrawal and the Taliban back in charge. How could this happen and what does it all mean? These are the questions this class tackles.
