# THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE UGLY OF HOW WE USED IT DURING THE "AMERICAN CENTURY"

**Course Description:** U.S. global influence is advanced by foreign policy decisions and interventions to accrue allies and partners and stymie adversaries. Constructive foreign policy utilizes diplomacy, trade, intelligence, foreign aid, and global environmental cooperation. The US military has been used (and at times misused) throughout the last 75 years along with our covert paramilitary forces to bend other nations to our will. The course will review some of the previous material involving the structure and cost of the military (with a deeper dive), assess where foreign policy and military action intersect or overlap, and evaluate return on investment from some of these interventions – both successful and unsuccessful. We will review case studies of American military use – overt and covert interventions which resulted in both foreign policy wins and losses. Then a look at the most dangerous friction zones on the planet that could start a global conflagration, and how I anticipate future wars might be conducted.

Course Director: Dr. Michael Baker has practiced general surgery and trauma for more than 40 years. He also had a parallel career in the military and teaches combat casualty care, triage, trauma, and response to complex disasters and humanitarian emergencies. He has published over 60 peer reviewed articles, and lectures on strategy, global health, medical intelligence, world events -- and serves on the Board of the World Affairs Council of Northern California. As a Navy Officer, he has experience in operational medicine, overseas deployments, war gaming, and strategic planning. He worked on contingency planning for various potential theaters of conflict including the Persian Gulf area as Naval Forces Central Command Medical Officer, plans and exercises for potential events in Korea / Asia as the Commander of US Naval Medical Forces Korea and Deputy Surgeon for U.S. Pacific Fleet, and served at US Strategic Command – America's nuclear deterrent force. He served his country in uniform for 30 years and retired with the rank of Rear Admiral, and on retirement was awarded his 3rd Legion of Merit, which he proudly wears alongside his Marine Corps Combat Action ribbon and the Combat Craft Riverine Warfare pin with his other awards.

Using his experience in both careers, he will inform the students about US foreign policy and the use and misuse of the military and other agencies that conduct "interventions" in other countries, to show where the U.S. have had good and bad results in spending the Legacy of the Greatest Generation.
