The Symphony as a genre I—the Classical era A course for OLLI, Winter 2018

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Course description: This course introduces the central musical genre of the 18th and 19th centuries, its history, its musical characteristics, and as a place to experiment and innovate.

Course objectives: To explore the birth of this beloved, authoritative, innovative genre as associated with the rise of the public symphonic concert, the development of our modern concept of "orchestra," and the progressive codification of the genre. The goal of the class is to analyze some representative examples of the first decades of the genre, by placing them in the cultural and social environment where they were created (composed, maybe commissioned, rehearsed, performed, and perhaps published).
